VISITING PROFESSOR Professor Alexander HILLEL

Department of Otolaryngology - Head & Neck Surgery Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine



Dr. Alexander Hillel is a Laryngologist and Airway Surgeon in the Johns Hopkins Department of Otolaryngology – Head & Neck Surgery. His clinical practice and research centers on the treatment, prevention, and causes of laryngotracheal stenosis (LTS). His laboratory developed model systems to study immunologic and metabolic mechanisms that promote LTS. Specifically, he and the laboratory are examining mTOR (mechanistic target of rapamycin) and its role in fibroblasts, immune cells, and epithelial cells to regulate inflammation leading to fibrosis. Dr. Hillel has translated these scientific advances to the bedside by completing the first interventional clinical trial assessing the safety of mTOR inhibitors as adjuvant therapy in iSGS patients – "Everolimus Clinical Trial in Idiopathic Subglottic Stenosis." Further, Dr. Hillel's laboratory is developing biomaterial applications, including a drug-eluting stent, to treat airway fibrosis and developing an Al voice biomarker screening tool to help patients identify severe airway disease to reduce the need for emergent surgery.

At Hopkins, Dr. Hillel is the Residency Program Director and Vice Director of Education in the Department of Otolaryngology – Head & Neck Surgery. Dr. Hillel is a council member of the American Broncho-Esophagological Association and serves on the leadership team of the North American Airway Collaborative (NoAAC) which is an international organization dedicated to improving our understanding of adult airway disease and developing effective, cost-conscious treatments.
