Dr Wei Wang is a distinguished Chief Physician with over 30 years of experience in plastic and reconstructive surgery, specializing in facial paralysis rehabilitation for more than two decades. He currently serves as the Head of the Facial Palsy Specialty Group in the Department of Plastic Surgery at Shanghai Ninth People's Hospital, leading one of the largest and most advanced facial palsy centers globally.

Dr Wang completed a prestigious Fellowship (2006-2007) under the mentorship of the Professor Julia K. Terzis, a world-renowned pioneer in facial reanimation, at Eastern Virginia Medical School. He also held visiting positions at Harvard Medical School (Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary). His clinical and research interests focus on comprehensive facial reanimation, including nerve transfers, free muscle transplantation, corneal protection, and neuroplasticity-based brain remodeling.

A/Professor Ian LOH is Head of Department, Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery, at Changi General Hospital (CGH). He also serves as Visiting Consultant in Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery across several public healthcare institutions.

His current and previous appointments include Director of the Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Service at CGH; Chairman of the Section of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Chapter of Otolaryngologists; and Member of the Taskforce on Aesthetic Medical Practice, Academy of Medicine Singapore. He sits on the National ENT Residency Advisory Committee and holds teaching positions at all three medical schools in Singapore.

An Adjunct Associate Professor at the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore, he has an extensive publication record spanning peer reviewed journals, textbook chapters, and anatomical dissection manuals. He has received multiple Best Educator and Dean's Excellence Awards. His clinical and public service contributions have been recognised with the SingHealth Outstanding Clinician Award, the SARS Courage Medal, COVID 19 Resilience Medal, COVID 19 Public Administration Medal, and in 2024, the Public Administration Medal awarded by the President of Singapore.
